Wednesday Evening Lenten Study

The Walk: Five Essential Practices of the Christian Life
Wednesdays from 6-7:15pm, beginning February 24th (Zoom)

During the season of Lent, we commit to preparing our hearts and souls for the good news of Jesus' resurrection on Easter. Historically, this is a season of fasting and spiritual discipline, where we intentionally focus on our relationship to and with God. This year, we will focus on growing closer to God through spiritual disciplines and practices throughout the Lenten season.

Please join us on Wednesday evenings beginning on February 24th from 6-7:15pm on Zoom. We will be working through a study series called *The Walk: Five Essential Practices of the Christian Life* by Rev. Adam Hamilton. In *The Walk*, Hamilton focuses on five spiritual practices that are rooted in Jesus' own walk with God and taught throughout the New Testament. Each of these practices is a part of our daily walk with Christ and an essential part of growing together in the church.

The video segments will be available for you to watch online each week in preparation for our study sessions, which will take place on Zoom. Covid-19 Vaccine -- Phase 1B

Washington State is now in Phase 1B of the Covid-19 Vaccine rollout. This means that current eligibility includes anyone who is over the age of 65, and all people 50 and older who live in a multigenerational household.

Some of our church members have shared that they have had success scheduling vaccinations through the **MyChart/Patient Portal** for both **Providence** and **Multicare**. **CHAS** is operating a mass vaccine clinic at the Spokane Arena, which has a limited supply of vaccines available daily. Vaccine appointment scheduling will reopen on Tuesday, February 9th at 5pm.

For those who are patients of Multicare, you can also call their automated vaccine information line at 833-770-0530 to be added to the vaccine waitlist and/or sign up for text updates.

If you are included in Phase 1B and need assistance with making an appointment for a vaccination, please contact the church office and we will try to help.
