John 12:1-19 (NRSV)

Six days before Passover, Jesus came to Bethany, home of Lazarus, whom Jesus had raised from the dead. Lazarus and his sisters hosted a dinner for him. Martha served and Lazarus was among those who joined him at the table. Then Mary took an extraordinary amount, almost three-quarters of a pound, of very expensive perfume made of pure nard. She anointed Jesus' feet with it, then wiped his feet dry with her hair. The house was filled with the aroma of the perfume. Judas Iscariot, one of his disciples (the one who was about to betray him), complained, "This perfume was worth a year's wages! Why wasn't it sold and the money given to the poor?" (He said this not because he cared about the poor but because he was a thief. He carried the money bag and would take what was in it.)

Then Jesus said, "Leave her alone. This perfume was to be used in preparation for my burial, and this is how she has used it. You will always have the poor among you, but you won't always have me."

Many Jews learned that he was there. They came not only because of Jesus but also to see Lazarus, whom he had raised from the dead. The chief priests decided that they would kill Lazarus too. It was because of Lazarus that many of the Jews had deserted them and come to believe in Jesus.

The next day the great crowd that had come for the festival heard that Jesus was coming to Jerusalem. They took palm branches and went out to meet him. They shouted, "Hosanna! Blessings on the one who comes in the name of the Lord! Blessings on the king of Israel!"

Jesus found a young donkey and sat on it, just as it is written,

Don't be afraid, Daughter Zion. Look! Your king is coming, sitting on a donkey's colt.

His disciples didn't understand these things at first. After he was glorified, they remembered that these things had been written about him and that they had done these things to him.

The crowd who had been with him when he called Lazarus out of the tomb and raised him from the dead were testifying about him. That's why the crowd came to meet him, because they had heard about this miraculous sign that he had done. Therefore, the Pharisees said to each other, "See! You've accomplished nothing! Look! The whole world is following him!"

Response: This is the Word of God for the people of God. Thanks be to God.

Christ Is Risen! Celebrate the gift of resurrection with us either in person on the north lawn at the church, or virtually on our Facebook page or website.

Notes for Those Attending In Person:

Parking: If you will remain in your car for the service, we will have some number of parking spaces reserved for "drive in" attendees in the eastern half of the parking lot, the majority of which will be "back in" spots. If you plan to sit outside, we encourage you to park in the western half of the parking lot or along Freya Street.

Seating: If you plan to sit outside of you car, we will have spots marked with a red/orange "X" on both the grass and the parking spots located closest to the grass. You are encouraged to bring your own lawn chair if possible, but we will have some plastic chairs available for those who need them.

Palms and Bulletins: We will have printed worship bulletins and palms available. Those who will remain in their vehicles will receive their palms from our Parking Lot Greeters as they arrive, and those who are sitting outdoors can receive them from our Lawn Greeters or at the table set up on the lawn.

Health and Safety: Face coverings and social distancing will be required for all who are outside of their vehicles. We have placed markings on the lawn and parking lot for chairs to be set up at 12' distances in order to accommodate households and families of all sizes. Anybody who has a fever or other symptoms of Covid-19, or who has been exposed to somebody who is sick, is asked to worship from home.

Weather: According to the current forecast, we can expect that the weather will be chilly (under 50 degrees) and windy. Be sure to dress warm and bring blankets.

Holy Week Outdoor Cross

Be sure to drive by the church throughout Holy Week to see the outdoor cross as it is decorated to reflect the story of Jesus' journey to the cross, the tomb, and his glorious resurrection. On Easter, the cross will once again be flowering with beautiful daffodils as a reminder of the new life made possible through Jesus' resurrection.

Lenten Prayer Wall

This Lent, we invite you to come to God in prayer again and again, weaving your prayers in with those of our larger community.

Throughout the season of Lent, we invite you add your prayers to our outdoor Prayer Wall. The prayer wall is located next to our Sanctuary along S. Freya near 65th. You can write your prayers on strips of burlap (burlap and sharpies also provided) and weave them into the wall as you offer your prayer to God. In addition to adding your prayers, we invite you to hold all of these community prayer requests in your own prayers throughout this season.

Covid-19 Vaccine -- Phase 1B, Tier 2

Washington State is now in Phase 1B, Tier 2 of the Covid-19 Vaccine rollout. This means that current eligibility includes anyone who is over the age of 65, and all people 50 and older who live in a multigenerational household. They have also expanded eligibility to many who work in healthcare, work/live in congregate settings, teachers, those who are pregnant, and those who have a disability that puts them at high risk.

Some of our church members have shared that they have had success scheduling vaccinations through the **MyChart/Patient Portal** for both **Providence** and **Multicare**. Appointments for vaccinations at the **Spokane Arena location** are now being managed by the Washington State Department of Health, and you can call the information hotline at 1-800-525-0127 and press #.

For those who are patients of Multicare, you can also call their automated vaccine information line at 833-770-0530 to be added to the vaccine waitlist and/or sign up for text updates.

If you are included in Phase 1B and need assistance with making an appointment for a vaccination, please contact the church office and we will try to help.
