Weekly Outdoor Worship Services

Sundays at 10:30am on the lawn at Moran UMC

Join us every Sunday morning at 10:30am as we gather outdoor worship services on the lawn at Moran UMC near the gazebo. Mask wearing and social distancing will be required for all attendees, regardless of vaccination status.

We recognize that the uneven surface of the lawn is not safe or comfortable for some of our members and guests, so we will have multiple ways to gather in person for this service to make it as accessible as possible. These options include bringing your own lawn chair to set up on the lawn, bringing a lawn chair or using a church chair and setting up on a designated area of the parking lot, or remaining in your vehicle in designated parking spots that will have a view of those speaking during the service.

Our services will also continue to be live-streamed on Facebook and our website at 10:30am, and you can access those virtual services in the same way that you have throughout the past year.

Parking: If you will remain in your car for the service, we will have some number of parking spaces reserved for "drive in" attendees in the eastern half of the parking lot, the majority of which will be "back in" spots. If you plan to sit outside, we encourage you to park in the western half of the parking lot or along Freya Street.

Seating: If you plan to sit outside of you car, we will have spots marked with a red/orange "X" both on the lawn and in the parking spots located closest to the lawn for those who are uncomfortable navigating the uneven lawn. You are encouraged to bring your own lawn chair if possible, but we will have some plastic chairs available for those who need them.

Worship Bulletins: We will have printed worship bulletins available. Those who will remain in their vehicles will receive their bulletin from our Parking Lot Greeters as they arrive, and those who are sitting outdoors can pick one up from our Lawn Greeters or at the table set up on the lawn.

Health and Safety: Face coverings and social distancing will be required for all who are outside of their vehicles. We have placed markings on the lawn and parking lot for chairs to be set up at 12' distances in order to accommodate households and families of all sizes. Please observe social distancing of 6+ feet from members of other households at all times, even if you have received our vaccinations. Anybody who has a fever or other symptoms of Covid-19, or who has been exposed to somebody who is sick, is asked to worship from home.

Reimagining/Reopening Update

The Reimagining Team is excited to share some changes to our guidelines for reopening at Moran UMC, bringing new opportunities for our church family to gather for worship and fellowship. At the

same time, we continue to be vigilant regarding the spread of new variants of the virus, and about our local covid-19 case rates here in Spokane County, which remain high.

Outdoor Worship: Beginning on Sunday, May 9th (Mothers' Day) we will be offering weekly outdoor worship services on Sundays mornings at 10:30am on the north lawn of Moran UMC, near the gazebo. We will also continue to live-stream these services on Facebook and our church website.

Prayer and Meditation: We have both outdoor and indoor space available for individual or family use for prayer and meditation throughout the week. Outdoors, our beautiful **Memorial Garden**, located just east of the accessible parking spaces and west of the gazebo, is available at any time. Indoors, the **Sanctuary** is open during staffed office hours (Monday, Wednesday, and Thursday from 10:00am – 3:00pm).

Outdoor Gatherings: Beginning May 1st, small groups of up to 10 people may meet outdoors at Moran UMC for worship, discipleship, and fellowship. Masks must be worn at all times and social distancing of 6+ feet must be observed. Each small group needs to have a coordinator/contact person who will work with Pastor Cody for scheduling and to ensure that procedures are followed. Leaders of ongoing small groups are encouraged to discern with their group members if a return to inperson gatherings is right for their group. We also hope that new small groups will be formed as we begin our return to in-person ministries; please contact Pastor Cody if you have an idea for a new group you would like to see, or if you would like to connect with a small group.

Indoor Gatherings: Beginning May 1st, the Fellowship Hall will be open on a limited basis for essential Ministry Team and Committee meetings with up to 10 people, with Zoom or outdoor meetings continuing to be preferred. This includes only the decision-making teams connected to the Church Council. Masks must be worn at all times and social distancing of 6+ feet must be observed. Chairpersons and Team Leaders who would like to hold an in-person meeting need to contact Pastor Cody for scheduling and to ensure that procedures are followed.
